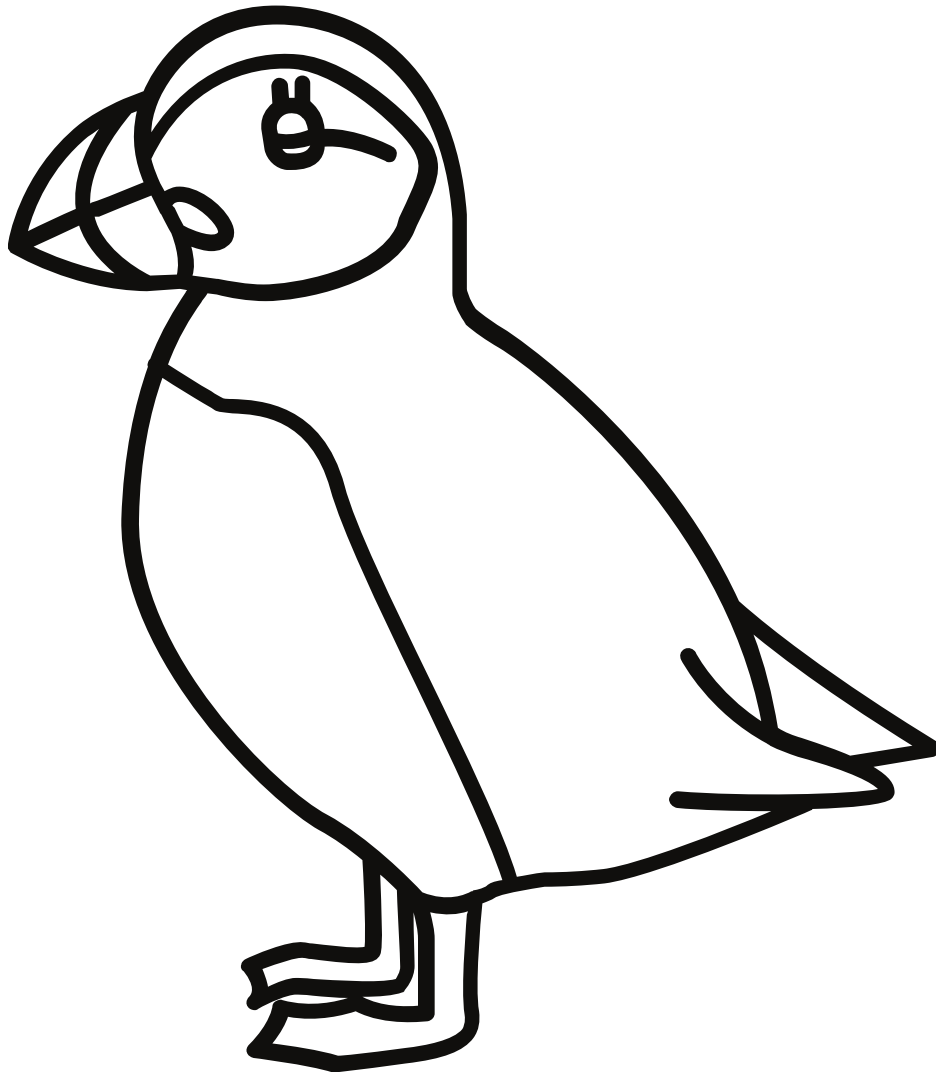

Atlantic Puffin

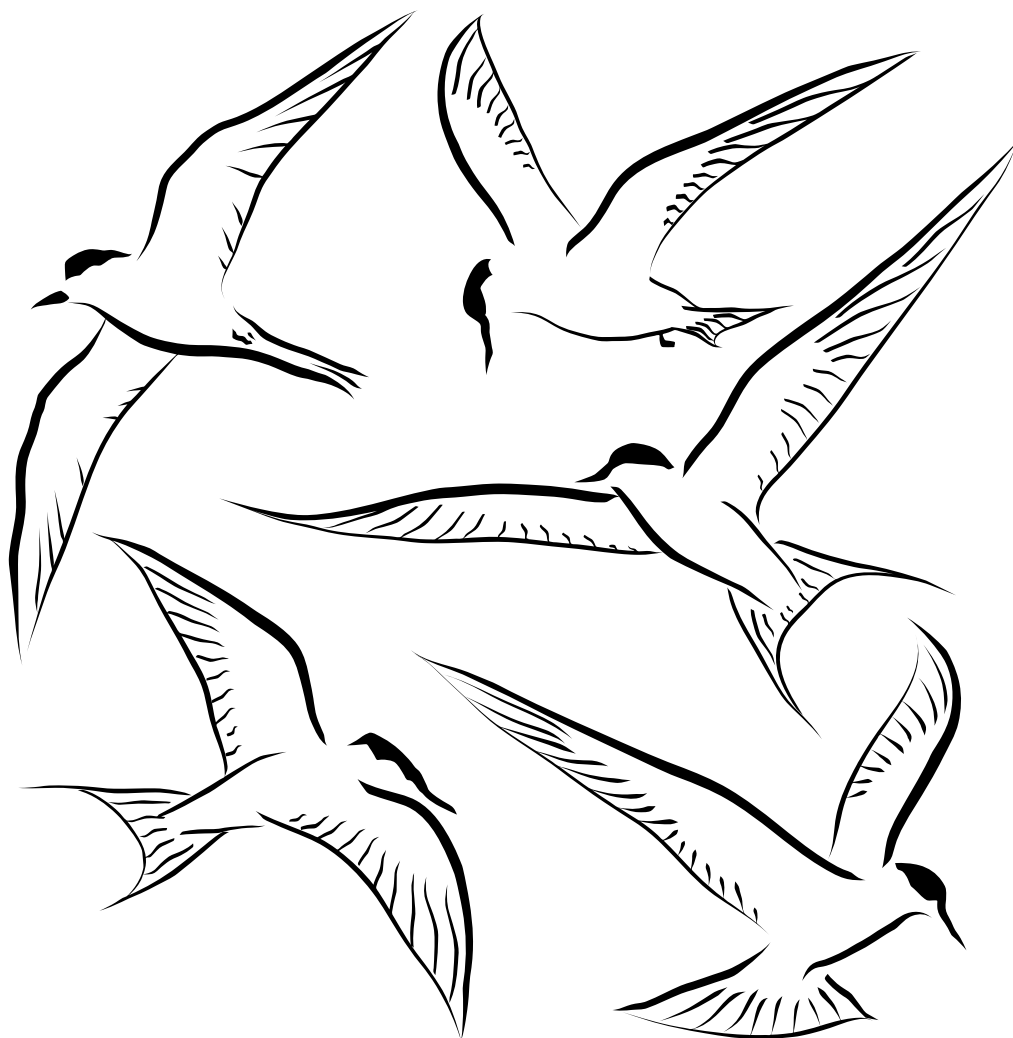
Fratercula arctica
